



Survivor Outreach Services



The Mission of the Survivor Outreach Services program:

Embrace and reassure Survivors that they are continually linked to the Army Family through a unified support program that enables them to remain an important part of the Army for as long as they desire.

The Survivor Outreach Services (SOS) program is an Army-wide program which demonstrates the Army's commitment to Families of the Fallen. SOS is a holistic and multi-agency approach to delivering services to Survivors by providing services at the garrisons and communities closest to where the Families live.

What is the Survivor Outreach Services (SOS) program?

The SOS program is an Army-wide program with a representative on most active-duty installations worldwide, and at least one representative in every State and territory of the United States.

What does the SOS program do?

- Serves the Families of all Army components within the State of Oregon: National Guard, Reserves, and Active Duty
- Provides information on the benefits and entitlements available to military Families
- Coordinates support groups
- Performs as an advocate on behalf of Survivors
- Provides budgeting/financial management resources
- Serves all military Families regardless of training status: M-day, Veteran, and Retired
- Provides life skills education resources
- Ensures access to all entitled benefits for Families
- Provides mental health counseling resources
- Provides estate planning resources
- Functions as long term support for Survivors
